Guide to MMAT Citizens' Gallery

We offer the Citizens' Gallery to rent with a fee, as a space for the display of the public's work. This venue for the exhibition of arts – such as painting, sculpture, calligraphy, crafts, and video – is accessible to individuals, groups, and organizations, regardless of whether you reside in or outside of Meguro.

■ Periods/Times of Availability

In principle, we lend the space in one-week units, excepting holidays.
Time of use for one day is from 10 am to 6 pm, which includes loading in, exhibition, and loading out time.

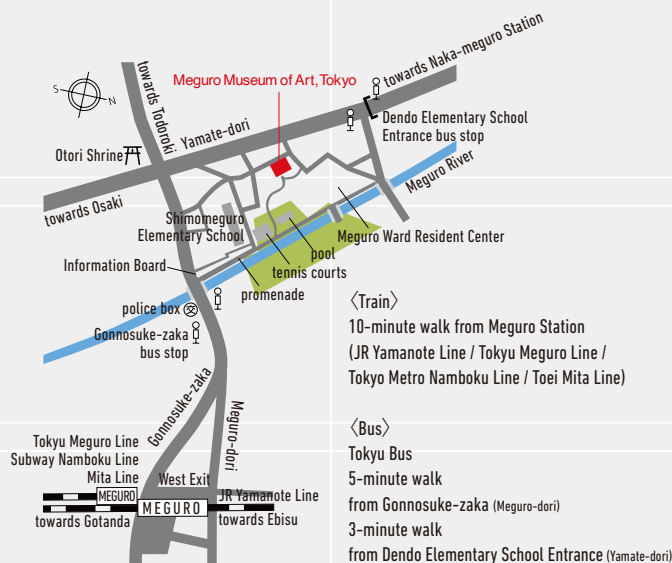
■ Application for Use

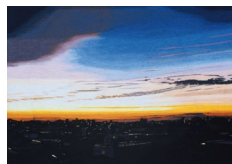

The Takeo TAKEI Exhibition Celebrating 130 Years of His Birth Welcome to the World of Fantasy

Takeo TAKEI, who popularized the term “DOUGA - a picture for children in Japanese” from the Taisho to the Showa period with the aim of letting children come into contact with real art. 2024 is the 130th anniversary of his birth. In addition to his works of DOUGA, we will exhibit “KANPON-SAKUHIN - various books TAKEI made originally and intentionally as artwork” and those originals, print works, and others to introduce the wide spectrum of his creations. We will also exhibit the works related to DOUGA by Yoshio AKIOKA, an affiliated artist of our museum.

MMAT has been forming a unique series of collections since its opening in 1987, shedding light on the works by artists closely related to Meguro, and also focusing mainly on the works by Japanese artists who studied or who played an active role in the international art scene. Simultaneously we will present “Daily Joy 2024 - Artists with Disabilities in Meguro” as below to introduce a wide variety of works.

Meguro Children’s Exhibition

January 18 (Sat) – February 2 (Sun), 2025

We will display works by children and students in kindergartens, elementary, and junior high schools, in Meguro; works of “touts de force - an amazing accomplishment” of the children, including craftworks, artwork, calligraphy and others worked on in class. You can feel the richly expressed emotions and ideas. They convey the creative urges and surprises found through the honest eyes of children. We also plan to exhibit the works by the children from the sister-cities overseas.

Journey to The Flower of Medieval ;Golden Tempera Painting

Featuring “Il libro dell’arte” by Cennino CENNINI, and Yasuo ISHIHARA

February 15 (Sat) – March 23 (Sun), 2025

The Tempera technique was widely used in the Western Medieval. We can enjoy the brilliant colors even now in altarpieces and illuminated manuscripts from the time. We at MMAT have organized workshops with the painter, Yasuo ISHIHARA, 7 times since 1992 to explore this technique. In this Exhibition, we will focus on “Il libro dell’arte” that transmits this Medieval technique, and will display the grand classic work of “Reproduction” created by ISHIHARA in Italy together with the process samples, colors and other materials to illustrate the charm of Tempera paintings.

Artists with Disabilities in Meguro “Daily Joy 2024”

October 26 (Sat) – November 17 (Sun)

The Paris 2024 Paralympic Games will be held this year. Following the one held at the time of Tokyo Paralympics in 2021, we are holding the “Daily Joy 2024” to exhibit the works by people with disabilities living in Meguro, with a focus on care facilities in Meguro City. This time, the Exhibition will be held in the MMAT main building, together with “MMAT Collection.”

Educational Activities

■ Meguro City Complex Guided Architecture Tour (April –May, about 4 times)

Guided tour of Meguro City Complex (formerly Chiyoda Life Headquarters, designed by MURANO Togo), by docents of professional architects.

■ Summer Workshops (July –August)

We will hold workshops in relation to the Takeo TAKEI exhibition, to be held in summer.

■ Spring Workshops (February – March)

Fun workshops with various themes in which both adults and children can participate.

■ Toy Collection Program, “Outreach” and “Toi-no-Hi”

A program for parents and children to play dynamically with building blocks and puzzles, with excellent designs from the toy collection of Meguro Museum of Art, Tokyo.

■ Art Café for Adults

Curators in charge of each exhibition speak around engaging stories, such as episodes from preparing exhibitions and so on, in a casual atmosphere.

■ Art Course

Various art programs including a talk series by the museum director will be held.

■ Art Appreciation Class (Gallery Tour)

The museum offers a museum visit program for schools inside and outside Meguro.

○ Design Camp PLUS

We run a workshop on design, in collaboration with PLUS Corporation Furniture Company.

○ Meguro Autumn Art

A music and art event co-organized by Meguro City, Meguro Persimmon Hall, and Meguro Museum of Art, Tokyo.
